Grad expenses a little overboard – includes, lights, awards, foods, décor and whole year awards. Emergency busses. Track and field – most schools charge for it, we don't. Class fans, salmons, culture night etc. Shade tent for teams, downpayment for gala, ipads.

EQAO – review of handouts. In summary - Kids are liking math more, like to read more. Attitude scores going up, actual scores going down (provincially)Primary school is at 82 board is at 75 (small sample)

Math - wondering is it language piece (French immersion). Thinking questions were most trouble. Everyone looking into (board, school etc). help clarify the language.

Juniors- grade sixes French and English doing well with reading but again fell down again in math. students like to read, write, math – attitudes going up.

Trends over time – can't compare different kids. Take three years and average it out 65% are at level 3 or 4 in patterning. Geometry 60% below. Data management 70% above number sense 70%. Parent event coming. Application and thinking questions

Last years EQAO Results come this week to parents.

Are they getting rid of the testing? Its good information. Doesn't rank schools. Some people don't care and want rid of it. Not a positive attitude towards it. Might look different in future. Lot of stress for kids. Prep on EQAO site. Some parents stress out and get tutors.

Thought eqao reflected format teachers taught at school. Some eqao cant use tools, some can. Primary is a lot of hands on doesn't translate well to pen and paper. Need to find balance. Standardized and field testing to thousands – questions asked every year.

Demonstration of questions kids are struggling with. – kids too worried about what formula to use. At what point do strategies become a barrier. (particularly junior kids) great at graphs and data, not at probability.

Now that the curriculum is being changed, how does that effect. Government focus on fundamentals. Not throwing everything out, refreshing. Things like pennies still in curriculum. Tweak and update. Very logical, used throughout world (Ontario document) balance simple and complex.

## Gala update

Underway. Booked Tosca 6:30, dinner 7:30 – move if needed. Menu similar, went out Friday. Posted reminder today. Donations for silent auction. Focus on getting larger items. Get donations, drop in office. Cutoff for tickets October 29 numbers to hall, add a few that week. Need 170. Tickets starting now. Full table \$400 (10 people) paid at one. Lulu is the biggest issue.

Upcoming events – open gym one Thursday a month – nothing planned yet. One Thursday Monique can teach European handball

Movie for one, change up what to do. D'youville will have one night as well

Hot dogs days Oct 15, December 10 (depends if moving week) Oct is good. Envelopes only. Healthy hunger – nothing on go – add on for lunches helping parents. Someone needs to take on, set up online, gets delivered, hasn't been a big hit here – maybe 20 or 30 so far. More of a convenience

Christmas – no pageant this year cause of move. What alternatives. 50<sup>th</sup> day history of rock and roll maybe culture day around x-mas instead. Do something in December but nothing that requires rehearsal etc. open house, gathering etc. culture night was awesome, huge success- maybe do with crafts, santa, food in hall etc. when we do pageant again, almost at capacity at church. All saints smaller. Change format. Maybe split out grades, afternoon and night etc.

Up to 340 kids and projected to grow

Look at first week of December as latest

Breakfast with santa – December 1 – conflict with communion retreats also santa parade. At appelbys. Santa, kids serve etc.

School swag – up and coming. Like to get shirts, toques, sweaters. Find the right suppliers to get shirts, look at subsidizing for some families.

Yard etiquette- what's happening – good – new students who don't speak English, older kids rally to help. Paired up with buddies. Friends stay together where possible in classes.

Yard not crammed, more pavement. Intermediates hanging out on landing. Maybe picnic tables to hang out. Bring them together to hang out. Bad - competitive sports -ultra competitive kids who must win. Competing outside school and in. space is never an issue lots of space. Sacrificing between keeping within earshot and giving more space. 5 or 6 adults, but harder to hear everything. Minimal fights a year (3-4) very minor. Very good community here. Embrace newcomers and know each other well. Language also an issue. Bad language heard more in the yard than the internet. Worse here than other schools. Many different people, backgrounds, parenting styles, family situations
